

Simplified Supply List for Acrylic 1-11

This checklist is intended to assist you in purchasing the art supplies you may need. If you have supplies from a previous class, please bring them along so we can assess whether you need to buy any additional items. Most, if not all, of these supplies can be found at Amazon, Cheap Joe's, or other art supply stores like Blick.

- Canvas panel boards or stretched canvases are available in value packs at an affordable price. They come pre-primed with gesso, an acrylic primer that helps prevent paint from bleeding or seeping. Prices and sizes may vary. If you're just starting, an 11x14-inch size is a good choice.
- Drawing Pencils (H, F, HB, B8). Or RVOGJP TAMATA Professional Drawing set for \$5.00. Eraser.
- Liquitex Professional Heavy Body Acrylic Paint, along with Titanium White, is an excellent choice for beginners. While other brands are available, look for "Heavy Body" acrylics. Prices can vary, so it's worth comparing.
- Don't spend too much on brushes. You can purchase a "W.A. Portman LTD" set on Amazon for a reasonable price. The set includes flat, filbert, and round sizes in assorted sizes and the case. Or Paint Brushes Set of 24 Pieces Wooden Handles Brushes with a Canvas Brush Case, Professional for Oil, Acrylic, and Watercolor Painting for \$10.00
- Clear Plastic 18" Ruler (Walmart sewing section).
- Palette paper is preferable, such as EBIVEN Palette Paper Paint Pad - 9"x12" Disposable Paint Palette Paper, 40 Sheets (48lb/68gsm) Paint Mixing Paper for Acrylic for \$8.00 and up.
 - ✚ An 18" ruler, a Plastic Container for water, paper towels, scissors, and other items you might have from a previous Acrylic class.
